## MARCUS REGAN HOW LEGACY CONFERENCE IMPACTED MY MINISTRY

My family attends Springwells Church in Dearborn, MI, and we are involved in several initiatives to reach Muslims. My wife Jennifer helps teach English and Bible lessons to Arabicspeaking women through an ESL ministry, while we also serve on outreaches conducted by our local church. This past summer, we joined other local Christians for weekly outreaches in the local parks, distributing Bibles and gospel literature, engaging people in conversation, and showing gospel movies such as "The Chosen."

In 2010 I attended my first Legacy Conference, after hearing about it from our good friend Barbara Yandell. I have attended every conference since, encountering people with years of faithful experience, labor, and sacrifice in ministry in general, and specifically to Muslims. Gleaning insight from these people is something special; it calls to mind Proverbs 13:20, "He who walks with the wise will become wise."

The Legacy Conference has helped me in two key ways. First, it has given me a good Biblical foundation for missions to Muslims, countering the syncretism promoted in key areas such as missions and Bible translation for Muslims. Second, the Legacy Conference has been a great encouragement as I hear stories of others' success and gain ideas about how I can change and grow in ministry. Like the apostle John said, I think our joy is "made complete" when we share the things we have seen and heard of Jesus (1 John 1:4). There is a great opportunity and call for everyone in the local Church to share Jesus with people, including Muslims. I say that as one who is not intrinsically bold at witnessing to people and starting conversations, I have found that the Legacy Conference motivates me toward confident witness.

Legacy is an excellent conference for those who are ministering to Muslims because Islam is such a unique challenge to the Church today—clearly and passionately positioning itself in defiance against the core tenets of the gospel. It's important for all kinds of people in the Church, whether engaging Muslims or not, to understand the challenge of Islam and how God's kingdom is advancing in response; the Legacy Conference provides a great opportunity for that.

### Indiana

### Afghan Refugees receive Christian outreach

Horizons staff member Dan Maley led a local volunteer team to help serve among over **7,500 Afghan refugees** temporarily based at Camp Atterbury, Indiana. These local church volunteers helped staff an activity center, supporting refugees as they prepared for their new lives in the US.

On base, the team shared food, played games, listened to refugees' stories and concerns, and advised them on how to adjust to life in the US. They also shared testimonies and engaged in gospel conversations, which **led several refugees to respond positively to the message of God's love**, receive Bibles, and take part in online Bible studies. The team also counseled and prayed with several refugees struggling with anxiety and depression due to the restrictions of refugee camp life, adapting to a new culture, finding jobs, and being separated from families.

After the relocation program ended in mid-January, **the team has continued to connect through messages, calls, and visits**, to offer practical help such as writing resumes, budgeting, and language lessons. The team has also connected a number of refugees to believers and churches in their new cities, including former missionaries to Afghanistan and other Horizons staff members!



### Kosovo

## A Horizons partner church lifts up its community and country

In Muslim-majority Kosovo, God is orchestrating a revival of its once-Christian heritage. Thirty years ago, there was only one evangelical church in Kosovo—but **today**, **20 out of the 38 municipalities in Kosovo have at least one evangelical church**, and that number is only increasing!

Horizons' church partner Messiah Evangelical Fellowship (MEF) has been at the forefront of this growth, actively participating in the nation's spiritual transformation through church planting and gospel outreach. In four years, **they have accepted 119 new converts from Islam, and they have planted 6 new churches**. As the spiritual landscape in Kosovo changes, MEF is positioned to serve the nation for Christ.

## HOUSE VISITS IN LEBANON **MEC INTERNSHIPS TRANSFORM LIVES**

Horizons Lebanon's house visitation and discipleship ministry has grown rapidly since 2012, when the Nabaa Center was first established. Over the last 2-3 years, the project grew even faster due to increased despair and desperation caused by Lebanon's compounding economic and health crises. Today, roughly 20 staff members and Middle East Center interns conduct house visits in regions throughout Lebanon, including areas that were hard to reach prior to the 2020 explosion in Beirut. Since the blast, over 50 people have committed their lives to Jesus, and 10 have already started attending churches!

### From Eve, new intern with Horizons:

During Lebanon's COVID lockdowns, I prayed for God to open up a way for me to serve in the field. He answered

my prayers by sending me on discipleship house visits with brother Charbel Chamoun. In my first 6 weeks, we visited many amazing people, both Christians and Muslims. I have served in street evangelism before, but I have never seen such hunger and thirst for God as I do now, in my country and so close to my neighborhood. I have learned that you don't need to travel far away to share the gospel; opportunities can be as close as your own town!

We met a Muslim woman whose husband had thrown her and their two children out of her house. She cried and poured her heart out to us. We listened, prayed for her, and shared the gospel. On our third visit, she said her husband had taken her and the kids back! She said, "I knew when you prayed that God would probably do something one day, but I did not expect it this quickly!" A few visits later, we asked her if she would accept Jesus as Lord—and she gave her life to Jesus that day! We still visit and study the Bible with her every week, and she testifies that she is at peace after coming to Christ.

At the same time, we also visited a divorced woman, physically abused by her husband, who had spent many nights in the streets because she had nowhere else to stay. She was separated from her son and wanted him to return to live with her. We prayed together for his return. The third week we visited, her son had returned to stay! She was overjoyed, as were we. We have been visiting every week to study the Bible with her—and she's a fast learner. In the last weeks of 2021, we asked her if she would accept Jesus as Lord and Savior. She said, "I would love to, and I wish all of my children would also!" So we prayed for her and she gave her life to Jesus!

These are only two experiences out of the many miracles and stories of redemption I have gotten to see in this ministry. People are enduring many heartbreaking and unbearable situations, but I am so grateful for how God is working, in every time and place. In crisis and in calm, God stays unshakeable and faithful: He will come through and He will save His children





From Rita Khreish, staff member and former intern:

I have always wanted to serve God in my professional life, so I was excited to be accepted

for Horizons' MEC Internship in graphic design. After months of training, I was hired as a staff member. In addition to graphic design, I serve through conducting house visits. Jesus said, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matt 4:19) and my experience in these visits is very rewarding, because I feel like I get to plant seeds that the Lord will grow in people's lives. The Lord so clearly prepares the ground for the meetings even before we arrive, and the Holy Spirit has opened the hearts of the people we preach to.

At the first house we visited, I felt the presence of the Lord filling the small home. The woman who lived there was Christian, and she suffers from leg problems. However, she believed that the Lord was with her, and His mighty hand was taking care of her. She was deeply touched that the two Americans in our group had left their country to come serve here in Lebanon. We all prayed for her, and gave her medicine and food portions.

One visit was to a Christian lady from a Muslim background who was afraid to declare her faith publicly. We discussed the story of Nicodemus with her and prayedand before we left, she promised to read the Bible more often and meditate on the Word, even if she had to conceal it. We also comforted and prayed for a Christian widow whose husband had died 40 days earlier. As we prayed, an American on our team felt the Lord saying that this woman is an influencer whose faith will transform the lives of the people around her.

Through these visits, I have learned that it doesn't matter how much we give, but rather how we give it. Love makes all the difference. I have seen people hungry for the Word and thirsty for the Truth that is Jesus. It takes humility to be able to serve those people and be Jesus' hands, feet, and mouth. They might need an encouraging word, a tender hug, or maybe simply someone to listen. What an honor it is for our Lord and King to minister to them through us. His Love never fails. (1 Corinthians 13:8)




