EARTHQUAKE Relief in Syria & Turkey





LAYA YAMOUT SERVING IN SYRIA THROUGH EARTHQUAKE RELIEF

My name is Laya and I serve with Horizons Lebanon. I was a Neonatal ICU nurse for three years but moved back to Tyre nine months ago to serve in the medical ministry. After the earthquakes hit, I joined a team from Horizons that went to Syria to assess the needs and see how we can support the churches there.

Syria is heartbreaking! There's so much damage. People are sleeping on the streets or in tents. It's really, really cold at night, but they have nowhere to go. They are surviving on food portions from churches, but they have to eat them right away because they don't have refrigerators. And people are living in trauma and fear—which has been worsened by many smaller aftershock earthquakes.

What makes it worse is that these people have already been through so much. They survived the civil war only to be hit by an earthquake. Thousands of buildings were damaged or destroyed by the war, but this completely shut down the infrastructure. None of the remaining buildings look safe to live in—balconies are falling apart, ceilings are crumbling, and electric wires are in the streets. There's no way of telling when the next stone will fall or when a balcony is going to break off.

I met a pregnant mother sleeping in a makeshift tent on the side of the road—she had nowhere else to go. People were going through piles of rubble trying to find their possessions and their legal papers, so they've even lost their identities. It's all completely gone.

Local churches have opened their doors to provide food and shelter, but they are overloaded—they need all the help they can get. People have been given food, blankets, and clothes, but their biggest need is a roof over their heads. At the church where we stayed, nearly 300 people were sleeping in shifts on the pews and on mattresses on the floor, day and night.

We held two church services for believers in the area, and many Muslims came and heard the gospel. Right now, it's as if people have stopped differentiating between Muslims and Christians everybody needs help. **Muslims are coming to Christians to ask for help, and that is leading to gospel conversations**. People have been so open. Normally, in Syria, this would not be okay, but God has opened new doors!

GLOBAL UPDATES

The Horizons International Asia (HIA) team has seen 19 Muslims come to Christ in the last year! Each weekend, up to eight evangelism teams are conducting gospel outreach on the city's streets, and more than **70 Muslim families are hearing the gospel through weekly home visits**. They have seen a particular increase in openness to the gospel among Indonesian women.

These outreach teams are equipped through discipleship and evangelism training events that are held four times a year. In the last 12 months, HIA has trained more than 100 people to effectively reach Muslims. Pray for salvation for the many Muslim families in the area, and for new believers to grow in discipleship.

SOUTH AFRICA

In December 2022, Nicole Ravelo-Hoërson traveled to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, to lead a conference that equipped Christian women to reach Muslims for Christ. Nicole presented a challenging message to correct the traditional stereotype of women being silent and submissive in Islam. It was an inspiring message about how Muslim women need to hear that true submission to the Lord is not restrictive or oppressive, but honoring and freeing.

The message was well-received, with many attendees realizing the importance of equipping women in their congregations to serve amongst Muslims. Some reported that they now felt compelled to reach Muslim women in their communities for Christ. Christians from Muslim backgrounds also shared how they were encouraged to persevere in witnessing to Muslims despite persecution!



Kosovo

Despite having just launched in November, the Balkan Institute for Missions (BIM) has wasted no time in **equipping the local church for ministry to Muslims** throughout former Yugoslavia and the rest of the Balkan region. Directly after its launch in November 2022, BIM organized its first training course at a Bible Seminary in Pogradec, Albania, with 15 students attending this event. A second training course was hosted by a church in Prizren, Kosovo, equipping more than 20 believers.

In March, Georges Houssney presented a Train the Trainers conference for church leaders in Durrës, Albania, to train fellow workers to equip their churches in evangelism. This inaugural event brought together around 40 leaders from Albania, Kosovo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Turkey, North Macedonia, Montenegro, and Serbia. Missionaries and leaders from outside the Balkan region also attended.

EARTHQUAKES DEVASTATE SYRIA AND TURKEY



At magnitude 7.8, the February 6 event was twice as powerful as the largest previously recorded earthquake in the region On February 6th, two powerful earthquakes rocked Turkey and Syria, causing an astonishing amount of destruction to huge areas of both countries. Since then, more than 50,000 people have died and over 150,000 have been injured, with numerous towns and cities left in ruins and hundreds of thousands of people displaced and without shelter.

Horizons earthquake relief project is working simultaneously in four heavily impacted areas (two in Turkey and two in Syria), collaborating closely with likeminded local churches to serve their communities efficiently and effectively.

In Turkey, we are providing temporary shelter, hygiene supplies, winter clothing, and meals. We also **plan to establish a construction team in Syria to help rebuild homes and resettle at least 200 families**, and provide up to 20 portable bathroom stalls to improve the hygiene conditions of heavily affected areas in Aleppo, Syria. In Shahbaa, Syria, we are helping our Kurdish church partner to expand its ministry by administering gospel-centered humanitarian aid in their community.


THE LORD **IS SHAKING THE NATIONS**




Ministering to earthquake survivors

In Iraq, the Gulf war brought thousands of Kurdish people to Christ, after years of little fruit. Within a year of the brief war, God grew the Church in Kosovo from 58 believers to over 3,000 converts—now there are 43 churches across the country. Civil war in Syria brought two million refugees to Lebanon-now we see tens of thousands of Syrians filling churches in Lebanon, Turkey, and Jordan.

Where the Lord is opening hearts to the gospel—that is our sign to follow him into those places. In Syria and Turkey, there are vast areas without schools or churches. We need to follow relief work with planting churches, Christian schools, and ministry centers that will make a spiritual impact in these areas, because this is where God is opening the hearts of our Muslim neighbors.

Though our hearts grieve with those who are suffering, we can also rejoice with those who are being saved, and join the Lord with anticipation as coworkers for his Kingdom. This is an extraordinary moment in time for us to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

The earthquakes that have so powerfully impacted Syria and Turkey struck at the intersection of three tectonic plates. The Arabian plate is moving northwards into Europe, pushing the Anatolian plate (where Turkey is located) westwards into the African plate. This movement builds up pressure along the fault zones, and the sudden release of this pressure has caused the earthquakes which
