

### HILKI:

#### A FORMER MUSLIM'S TESTIMONY

My name is Hilki. I grew up Muslim in Kosovo, believing that Islam was the only true religion. While I frequently attended the Mosque to show devotion to God, I felt empty; my efforts at religion never gave me freedom from sin. Then, my cousin in Finland shared Christ with me.

I began earnestly reading the Bible and comparing it to the Quran, finding to my surprise that the Bible spoke with authority. I was confused, and began to pray earnestly that God would show me the way. After months of inner turmoil, I had a vision of Christ that convinced me I had truly found God. At twenty-one, I was baptized and my entire life changed. I became a new person and saw the world through new eyes.

Since then, I have had the joy of serving with B.U.M. Church in Kosovo. Our church was founded in 1994 when Pastor Femi and a couple of friends began meeting together for Bible study, and Georges Houssney began mentoring them through the process of planting a church. I joined them shortly after, and through Georges' mentorship, began to serve as an elder. I cannot imagine how B.U.M. Church would have grown in numbers, vision, and leadership without Georges' help and support.

In 2012, B.U.M. sent me to plant a church in eastern Kosovo. Eventually, this vision expanded from planting one church to establishing churches throughout Kosovo in villages where there are none. While Kosovo's Muslim religion and secularism creates tough ground for ministry, we have seen God at work. Through my years as pastor and church planter, I have seen hundreds of Muslims come to faith in Jesus, and we are already starting to see a transformation in Kosovo.

Just as Jesus has changed my heart, I pray that new believers will form communities that change our nation and culture as lights for the gospel. Bless you all!

## CUBS TO LIONS

Cubs to Lions is now being offered online!

As part of a new initiative to provide discipleship and fellowship for Christians from Muslim backgrounds (CMBs), Horizons has started hosting twice-monthly online gatherings for graduates of Cubs to Lions conferences. The initial meeting on July 20th saw 19 CMBs gather with Georges Houssney for a time of practical teaching on marriage, as well as mutual encouragement and prayer. At that meeting, the graduates asked if the meeting could be held every other week!

Formed in response to travel and meeting restrictions due to coronavirus, this virtual adaptation of the effective Cubs to Lions training methodology is allowing CMBs to share and receive support in their difficulties with marriages, social life, faith challenges, and more. As these believers connect with those who have faced similar experiences and gain wisdom for the Christian life, we pray that their faith will be strengthened and proved out during this time of trial.

### Campus Ministry Challenges

International students enrolled at universities are facing serious challenges due to the recent uncertainty about online and in-person scheduling. Coronavirus quarantines could force many to return to their own countries mid-semester. Amid these students' difficult decisions, International Crossroads has been adapting to new opportunities to support them through friendship, discipleship, and practical help.

In Albany and other locations, staff members have started working in other structures—such as tutoring, how-to seminars, and English language classes—in order to provide practical help that universities themselves can endorse and promote. These services increase engagement with international students, and open up time and space to build relationships. Additionally, some ministry locations are hosting outdoor social events that conform to local regulations.

The harvest is ripe, and even during the pandemic, the gospel has been spreading to students from all over the world. Please pray for ISM teams as a new and uncertain semester starts, that they can boldly share Christ's love with students.

# THE MOMENT OF IMPACT

#### TRIPLE CRISIS SENDS LEBANON **REELING AFTER EXPLOSION DEVASTATES BEIRUT**

On August 4th, 2,700 tons of ammonium nitrate exploded in a port in Beirut, leaving over 200 dead and 6,000 injured. Since October, Lebanon has experienced an economic downturn and high inflation due to government corruption. In February, coronavirus lockdowns compounded the problem with hyperinflation and high unemployment, devastating Syrian refugees and Lebanese citizens alike. The explosion sent the city reeling, with hospitals overloaded and more than 300,000 displaced from their homes. The blast destroyed the national grain stockpile, as well as Lebanon's largest port, from which it receives most of its imports.

# Where were you on September 11<sup>th</sup>?

#### HERE'S WHERE WE WERE ON AUGUST 4TH

The Beirut blast is considered one of the largest nonnuclear explosions in history, forever leaving its mark on Lebanon. Just as 9/11 was a watershed moment for all Americans, so the Beirut explosion will live on in Lebanon's national memory for generations. Read the testimonies of Horizons staff members who experienced that fateful moment:

"I just stood in the middle of the room thinking, 'I should have a plan if there are more explosions!"

"That night I had planned to bring rent money to my landlord's house near the port. At the last minute, God pulled at my heart to stay home and pray, so I called her and cancelled. As I sat down to start praying, an explosion went off. I freaked out and looked outside to see what was going on and saw red flames rising. I backed away from the glass as the TV and doors began rattling our whole building was shaking. Then the second big explosion hit. I thought, "We are dead. We will turn into ashes!" When things finally settled from the impact, I ran to make sure my mom was okay. She was afraid and thought our building was being bombed, so we clung to the wall. We tried to call my dad but phone service was down. We waited helplessly until it came back on and ensured he was safe. If I had gone to pay the rent and hadn't given importance to God's voice inside, I wouldn't be here to share this testimony.

It is truly a miracle; every room in our apartment complex has broken windows except ours."



Immediately after the horrific explosion in Beirut on August 4th, Horizons staff took to the streets to minister to those affected by this tragic event. Joining hands with our 42 partner churches, our staff teams are preparing and distributing food packages, repairing damaged homes, providing vital medical care, and taking time to listen to and pray with people impacted by this traumatic event.

The political protests, COVID lockdowns, and Beirut port explosion have destroyed Lebanon's already fragile economy and left millions of people in desperate need. As the country has reached a new level of crisis, Horizons' Coronavirus Emergency Relief Fund has been rolled into the new Lebanon Crisis Fund. Additionally, Horizons partnered with **Christian author Ann Voskamp** for the Show Up Now for Lebanon campaign. Through the Lebanon Crisis Fund and Show Up Now for Lebanon, we have currently raised over \$650,000 to provide critical relief work!

The economic crisis is showing no signs of improvement, and the Lebanese government reports that citywide repair costs will exceed \$10 billion. Additionally, significant increases in COVID-19 transmissions are now expected, with residents largely unable to follow the usual precautionary measures such as social distancing.
